
Crataegus monogyna and Saturnia pavonia

<u>Saturnia pavonia</u> or "Small emperor moth" is a big moth of the family Saturniidae, and inhabits a wide range of habitats, but is most often associated with heather and bramble (rubus sp.)

The carterpillar preferres to feed on Rosaceae and Ericaceae, and adults feed on nectar of different plants, also such as the "Common hawthorn" <u>Crataegus monogyna</u>.

1 can recall this beautiful noctural-butterfly to the area of Agiasos in Lesvos and its deciduous forest area, where by chance I saw this rare specie quiently standing on a branch, and transmitted to me sensation of mystery, night and beauty. In the Autumn, Mediterranean locals used to collect berries of "θαμνομουρτζιά", and use them as "ethic foods" to prepare jams. Another way of transmitting tradition and culture.
