## Parnassius apollo and Centaurea jacea

**Parnassius** apollo, or "Apollo" is a very rare an amazing butterfly of the family Papilionidae, and typically a mountain specie that prefers slopes, alpine meadows and mountain pastures. It has a wide range of subspecies and variants, and is of high interest to entomologists.

Larvae feed on a variety of *Sedum sp*. Providing to the insect a repulsive taste for predators thanks the bitter chemical compounds of the plants they feed. Adults can feed sipping also from the Asteraceae, "Knapweed" *Centaurea jacea*", and can be seen from May to September.

Very rare to see butterfly, at the mountain-top of Parakoila's mountains "Τριεθνές / Προφίτης Ηλίας". It's rarity, colours and elegance made me thought about what rare is to find too unique souls and "beautiful" beings in life to love, but of course, there are.

Like perhaps the ancient Greek poetress  $\mathbf{\Sigma}\mathbf{\alpha}\mathbf{\pi}\phi\mathbf{\acute{\omega}}$ , "Sappho", with her little works that survived, love poems characterized by sentimentality and immediacy, such as "Y $\mu$ vo $\varsigma$   $\sigma$ th $\nu$  A $\phi$ po $\delta$ (th $\tau$ )".

The pure love, and passionate feelings and its glorification, it is also a "rare" thing to be seen.
