## **Zygaena filipendulae** and **Centaurea solstitialis**

**Zygaena filipendulae**, or **"Six-spot burnet"** is a small day-flying moth of the family Zygaenidae very common throughout Europe. It can be found in meadows and woodland clearings, and areas rich in grasses and flowers.

Larvae feed on a variety of fabaceae plants, and adults feed primarily on nectar of Asteraceae family plants, scabious and thistles, "Yellow star-thistle", *Centaurea solstitialis*.

Among many other spots, I can relate this beautiful butterfly to the Charamida beach area in Lesvos.

Adults fly on hot sunny days. The upper wings dark metallic blue-greenish with six vivid red spots, and the hind wings red with a blackish fringe, provoqued in me feelings of passion and joy while observing them onto the charming yellow star-thistle.

Using possibly the words of the Greek poet  $\Gamma$ Eώργιος  $\Delta$ Pooting, "Georgios Drosinis "in his poem "Παπαρούνες", the six-spot burnet, red and black like a poppy, like slender girls with red summer-umbrellas in the fields...it provides passion and joy, happiness while watching them.
